# **Stories Worth Telling**


The Thomas M. Wernert Center (TMWC) is pleased to participate in the Toledo premier of *The Willard Suitcases*, a musical by Julianne Wick Davis. TMWC also is supporting an exhibit of photographs by Jon Crisin that inspired the production.

"More than 400 suitcases were found in the attic of the Willard Psychiatric Center, containing remnants of lives forgotten," says Rosie Best, Artistic Director of Toledobased Issue Box Theatre. "We are doing this production to bring visibility and dignity to those whose lives have often been dismissed, ignored, or silenced."

In 1995, a handful of forgotten suitcases were discovered in the recently closed

Willard Psychiatric Center in upstate New York, untouched since their owners checked in years before. The performance of the musical and the display of the photographs uses the arts to illuminate the stories of the patients and to acknowledge the history of mental health in America.

Issue Box Theatre uses the arts to address social justice. Whether working with people with mental illness, survivors of human trafficking, or young artists, Issue Box Theatre works to amplify the stories of the vulnerable with dignity.

TMWC members began their first meeting in March with a group discussion on what advocacy means, why it is important, and areas they would like to grow as advocates. The group also brainstormed ways to engage in community volunteer opportunities.

To date, the group's efforts have focused on collecting food item as part of the Equality Toledo Food Drive, assembling toiletry bags with shampoo, conditioner, soap, and lotion for distribution to TMWC and residents of Uptown Toledo, and participating this summer in the Keep Toledo Luas County Beautiful 'Litter League." Team Recovery Together is excited to be a part of keeping Toledo clean! In addition to their

endeavors to give back to the community, the participants of the Recovery Together Advocacy Group continue to learn more about what it means



to be a strong advocate. Typical meetings include discussions about types of advocacy, volunteering, communication skills, building momentum, challenges, and barriers.

The Recovery Together Advocacy Group is open to all TMWC members and meets in the Clubroom on the first three Tuesdays of the month at 12:00 p.m.
